General MT Advisement Information

- The MT program is fall semester start only. Students who wish to begin the program in the spring semester will have an additional semester added to their studies.
- MT students are required to complete all core courses (in RED above) as seated courses and cannot take online courses.
- The MT program Orientation for new students is held the week prior to the start of the fall semester.

- While this is a credit-bearing program, there are also “clock hours” considerations and students should not miss class
 - No more than 2 absences are allowed in clinical courses
 - See course syllabi for attendance policies
 - Students must make up coursework and/or hours if they have extenuating circumstances
- Liberal Arts courses may be completed in any order. Please consult the College Catalog for any prerequisite requirements.
- BIO 130/130L and BIO 131/131L must be completed during the first year of the program or during the summer before the start of the second year.
- Open labs are scheduled as needed to practice skills – see the Program Director
- Students may register for the Mercy Action Project MAP 100 in any semester as long as the requirement is completed prior to graduation.
- The MT Certificate option is available for students who do not wish to complete the AAS degree and will enable students to be eligible to sit for the certification exam.
 - Board exams are held in August and January
